Trees

- 1. Find a tree or bush near your house.
- 2. Explore the tree: touch it, smell it, listen to it and if the tree is strong enough, climb it.
- 3. What signs of spring can you find on your tree?
- 4. Are there any buds starting to form?
- 5. Visit your tree everyday, observe what has changed.
- 6. Take a picture of the same part of the tree everyday



Colour Pallette

- 1. Use an index card or thicker card stock paper.
- 2.Go outside.
- 3. Collect as many colours as you can by making smears on your page. Use your fingernail, rock or stick to squeeze the colour out of grass, leaves and soil.
